



TMJ Made Easy: Simple Treatments for Common Problems



# MEMBER OPINION THE BORING DENTIST

My favorite dentist movie of all time has to be *Eversmill New Jersey*. In this 1989 comedy drama, Daniel Day Lewis stars as a dentist traveling around Patagonia, Argentina, providing dental services to the needy, funded by a foundation in New Jersey called Eversmile



The movie chronicles his experience riding a motorcycle, meeting in social and professional relationships, and finally going off into the sunset with his new girl, on his motorbike. What I find so funny is that throughout the movie whenever he gets into a sticky situation, he always uses the phrase, "I'm a Dentist!" to try to impress people or get himself out of trouble. Of course, it never works.

Dentists have rarely been well portrayed in the movies and on television. Last week I was watching an investment show and they suggested that making stock selections is much like choosing a dentist—you want someone humble and competent.
